



Expedition To Antarctica

14-day/11-night journey to Earth's last frontier, where whales, seals and penguins mingle among turquoise glaciers and glimmering icebergs

Departures: January 4 to 17 | January 17 to 30, 2023



Spend two nights in vibrant Buenos Aires, Argentina, and enjoy a nine-night, five-star cruise to "The White Continent." Retrace sea lanes navigated by storied explorers Shackleton, Amundsen and Scott. Be among the fortunate few to set foot on this pristine wilderness. Enjoy guided excursions led by an expedition team of naturalists aboard sturdy Zodiac crafts amid floating ice sculptures, intricate ecosystems and abundant wildlife—including humpback whales, leopard seals and Adélie penguins. Extend your expedition with the Iguazú Falls Post-Program Option, which includes Buenos Aires/Iguazú round-trip airfare.



14-Day/11-Night Itinerary

1 Depart the U.S. or Canada

- 2-3 Buenos Aires, Argentina—Arrive in Buenos Aires and check into the five-star INTERCONTINENTAL BUENOS AIRES HOTEL. See the colorful La Boca district; Monserrat's grand public buildings; historical Plaza de Mayo; Palermo's lavish parks; Puerto Madero's lively riverfront; and the old quarter of San Telmo. Visit the city's historical Recoleta Cemetery.
- **4 Buenos Aires/Fly to Ushuaia/Embark the ship**—Fly to Ushuaia. Embark the ship this afternoon and cruise through Beagle Channel, named for the ship that carried Charles Darwin on his South American voyages. Attend the Captain's Welcome Reception.
- **5-6 Cruising the Drake Passage**—Cross the legendary Drake Passage and, upon reaching the Antarctic Convergence, watch for breaching fin and humpback whales and seabirds feeding on plankton and krill.
- 7 Port Lockroy/Jougla Point—Visit Port Lockroy—an intelligence post for British espionage during World War II that was later converted into a whaling station and scientific base. Gain insight into the daily activities of past researchers at the living museum known as "Base A" and mail a postcard stamped with an Antarctica postmark from the official British Post Office.
- 8 Petermann Island/Lemaire Channel—Call at Petermann

Island and watch its thriving rookeries of penguins and blue-eyed shags. Cruise through the Lemaire Channel, where seven majestic miles of mountains and interweaving patterns of ice floes brim with wildlife.

- 9 Continental Landing Neko Harbor/Paradise Harbour—Listen for the rumbling of Rudolf Glacier as it calves slabs of ice into Neko Harbor. This spectacular harbor is one of the most dramatic sights on your expedition. Here, mark your continental landing in Antarctica. Cruise through Paradise Harbour.
- 10 Deception Island/South Shetlands Islands/ Half Moon Island—Deception Island encircles the Port Foster caldera, where the ship enters through Neptune's Bellows—a harbor ringed by snowcapped peaks and sheer cliffs. Marvel at the crescent-shaped Half Moon Island site of Cámara Station, a base monitored by Argentine biologists studying regional wildlife. Enjoy the Captain's Farewell Reception.
- 11 Cruising the Weddell Sea—Cruise below the 60th parallel south to the outer shores and islands of the Antarctic Peninsula. A vast array of marine wildlife flourishes here in this pristine wilderness—millions of penguins, countless seabirds and thousands of seals and whales.
- 12 Cruising the Antarctic Convergence/Beagle Channel/ Ushuaia, Argentina—Complete your crossing of the

Drake Passage with the rounding of Cape Horn, the graveyard of sailors and hundreds of ships that once battled the westerly winds. At Cape Horn, the ship will go east before turning north once more towards Beagle Channel back to Ushuaia.

- 13 Ushuaia, Argentina/Disembark ship/Fly to Buenos Aires/Depart for the U.S. or Canada—Disembark in Ushuaia and fly to Buenos Aires.
- 14 Arrive in the U.S. or Canada

POST-PROGRAM OPTION Iguazú Falls

The UNESCO World Heritage site of Iguazú Falls, among the world's most spectacular natural wonders, is situated in one of South America's last remaining virgin rainforests. Spanning nearly the Argentinian border of Brazil, Iguazú Falls is three times as wide and nearly twice as high as Niagara Falls. Visit Parque das Aves jungle reserve, home to more than 350 species of birds, 66 varieties of mammals and an array of reptiles, fish and flora. Includes one night in the five-star INTERCONTINENTAL BUENOS AIRES HOTEL and two nights in the five-star MELIÁ IGUAZÚ FALLS. **Buenos Aires/Iguazú round-trip airfare is included.**
