

# Scotland's National Drink

France may be known for its wine, and Ireland for Guinness, but only the Scots can claim Scotch whisky—as it's spelled—as their national drink. It's no wonder they call it "water of life," which comes from the Gaelic "uisge beatha." With a unique heritage stretching back more than 500 years, the craft and longevity of creating a complex and diverse range

of Scotch whiskies is a serious and competitive multi-billion dollar annual industry. To be deemed "Scotch" whisky, distillers must adhere to strict regulations. The scotch must be made in Scotland, from fermented grain mash—and aged in oak barrels for at least three years to achieve its signature color and flavor. There are



six types of scotch that are all produced in different ways, but serious scotch drinkers prefer single malt. When tasting scotch, you might refer to its woody, grassy, fruity, peaty, or fragrant notes. Be sure to sample a wee dram of Scotch whisky, preferably in a proper whisky nosing glass. Savor the warm aroma, unique taste, and singular experience of Scotch whisky, and don't forget to toast by saying, "Slainte!"





The Men of the North were cast as barbarians who plundered their way across the known world during the enigmatic Viking Age, which prevailed for almost 300 years between the 8th and 11th centuries. They sailed on dragon ships from Norway to settle in Scotland around A.D. 800—in Jarlshof on the Shetland Islands and in the Hebrides, where over one hundred villages are still known by their originally settled Norse names, solidifying the enduring historic link between Norway's Vikings and Scotland's clans. Some of Scotland's best-known clans—the Clan Donald and Clan MacLeod—came from Norse ancestry, influencing the distinct dialects still spoken today on the Orkney and Shetland Islands. The nuances and rich histories of these two complex and deeply intertwined cultures await your discovery across these verdant and storied lands.

# Depart Home City Day 1

Depart your home city for Glasgow, Scotland.

# Glasgow, Scotland/Embark Day 2

Arrive in Glasgow and transfer to embark LE CHAMPLAIN. Set sail accompanied by soulful sounds of a Scottish bagpiper. (D)

# Isle of Iona Day 3

Visit the Inner Hebridean Isle of Iona, the birthplace of Christianity in Scotland and burial place of Scottish kings. Revel in an in-depth, guided visit to its restored abbey and marvel at the intricate Celtic crosses. Return to the ship for lunch on board with the option for leisure time back on shore to experience its idyllic beauty. Attend the Captain's Welcome Reception and Dinner. (B,L,R,D)

# Kyle of Lochalsh/ Isle of Skye

### Day 4

Visit Eilean Donan Castle, one of the world's most recognized castles—located on a tiny island in the midst of some of Scotland's most dramatic scenery. Named for the 6th-century Irish saint who established the first community on the island, learn the rich history of this castle, dating to the 13th century, and its clansmen. Take a scenic drive to admire the Isle of Skye with its 11 peaks of the Cuillin Mountains and dramatic peninsulas. Visit a historic, award-winning distillery for an authentic taste of Scottish whisky. (B,L,D)

# Kirkwall/Orkney Islands Day 5

Head into the west of Mainland, Orkney's largest island, to visit the Neolithic Heartland of Orkney, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. View the sacred Standing Stones of Stenness and visit the early Orcadian settlement of Skara Brae to see the dwellings revealed from beneath the sand dunes. Then, follow the coastline of Scapa Flow, made famous for its role in both World Wars, before visiting St. Magnus Cathedral. Also known as the "Light of the North," the cathedral was built by Vikings during their 500-year reign over the islands. Listen to a Scottish bagpiper as you re-board the ship in Kirkwall. This evening, enjoy a storyteller's performance of traditional Scottish tales. (B.L.D)

# Lerwick/Shetland Islands Day 6

Dock in Lerwick and travel to the island's southernmost point as you pass through the rural townships of Fladdabister









with a view of the magnificent Mousa Broch—weather permitting—the tallest and best preserved broch in the world. Visit the archaeological site of Jarlshof, pending UNESCO designation, uncovered by a violent storm in the winter of 1896 to 1897. See the remains of more than 5,000 years of human history, including an Iron Age broch and wheelhouse, late-Neolithic stone houses, a Bronze Age village, Norse longhouses, and a 16th-century laird's house. Look for sightings of Shetland's famous ponies on the way back to the ship. (B,L,D)

### Sognefjord, Norway/ FLÅM RAILWAY Day 7

This morning, board the FLÅM RAILWAY, one of the world's most scenic train journeys, traveling 13 miles through 20 tunnels to Myrdal's

mountaintop station. Watch as snowcapped mountains and cascading waterfalls—including the awe-inspiring Kjosfossen—unfold along this branch of the world-renowned BERGEN LINE alongside intriguing hamlets. Back on the ship, cruise the mighty Sognefjord, passing traditional farmsteads and villages flanked by majestic mountains and glaciers. Rejoin the ship to cruise past stunning waterfalls and steep mountainsides. (B,L,D)

### Bergen Day 8

Enjoy a panoramic tour of Bergen as you travel to the summer home and living museum of famed Norwegian composer Edvard Grieg. Stroll the grounds of Troldhaugen, Grieg's home for 22 years, where he composed many of his best-known works. The living museum features an exhibition center, concert hall, composer's cabin, and Grieg's villa dating from 1885. Then, visit the Fantoft stavkirke, a 12th-century wooden stave church demolished by fire in 1992, and painstakingly rebuilt in its original post and lintel construction. Take a walking tour of the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Bryggen, Bergen's historic waterfront. Enjoy time at leisure then the Captain's Farewell Reception and Dinner this evening. (B,L,R,D)

## Bergen/Disembark/ Return to Home City Day 9

Following breakfast, continue on the Post-Program Option or transfer to the airport for your return flight home. (D)
